

Getting there and back...

Monday 18th July

- 00:30 Coach arrives at Etone College
- 01:00 Coach departs from Etone College
- 05:30 Check in at DFDS ferry port, Dover
- 07:40 Depart from Dover
- 10:00 Arrive in Calais (local time)
- 13:00 Arrive at the hotel (VJH Antwerp "'Pulcinella")

Getting there and back...

- Please drop your child off and pick them up from the main car park outside the leisure centre (00:30 drop off)
- As we are on the coach for a long time we recommend bringing some food, something to drink and some form of <u>sociable</u> entertainment.








Accommodation

- VJH Antwerp "Pulcinella", Bogaardplein Antwerp
- This accommodation is on a bed and breakfast basis. Students will receive a continental breakfast each morning and an evening meal but will need to bring some spending money for lunches.





• You need to make sure you bring your own towels.





- The currency in Belgium is the Euro (€)
- All accommodation and excursions are already paid for.
- We would advise around €20 per day spending money (lunch, souvenirs, public transport), however there will be opportunities for shopping during free-time.
- It is the students' responsibility to look after their money and budget sensibly.





What to pack

- The weather in Brussels is similar to the weather in Britain at this time of year.
- It will be warm but it also may rain so students will need to dress accordingly.
- We will be doing a lot of walking so students will need practical and comfortable footwear.
- A raincoat might be a good idea!
- Remember to bring a towel for the hotel and adapters for plugs.
- Consider a portable charger for the long coach journeys!

In the event of an emergency

- Prior to the trip:
 - we follow the latest government travel advice with regards to travelling abroad
 - we have completed a comprehensive risk assessment to review any likely incident
- During the trip:
 - we would follow the advice given by the emergency services
 - ensure that all pupils are safe
 - contact school to inform them of the situation
 - contact parents/carers with updates



Expectations



- Normal school expectations and sanctions do still apply.
- If you are given an instruction by a member of staff you are expected to follow it – this is to ensure that the trip runs safely and smoothly for everyone involved.



Phones



- Phones are allowed but they are the students' own responsibility (i.e. lost, roaming charges, data, etc.).
- Students are allowed to take photos of themselves but not of other students/members of the public.
- No music to be played on the coach.
- No use of social media.
- Time will be given each evening to contact parents/carers.
- Any misuse of a phone will result in it being confiscated for the remainder of the trip.



Communication



- Students will be given time each evening to call home
- Travel updates and photos will be regularly posted on our department X account (@etone_mfl)
- Students will be given a staff phone number to call in the case of an emergency



Passports, EHICs and forms



- Passports will be kept in the school safe from tonight until we leave on Monday 15th July.
- It is strongly recommended that you apply for a GHIC card and bring it with you on the day of departure.
- It is your responsibility to ensure that you arrive ready for departure.







- Please fill out the Health and Safety Form on behalf of the travel company and return it to a member of staff.
- Please fill out the Microsoft Forms with your child's passport information.
- If you have brought your child's passport in this evening, please leave it with a member of staff before you go.
- If you have not brought your child's passport in this evening, please can you ensure that it is in school no later than Friday 28th June.
- If your child has any medical needs or dietary requirements that haven't been shared, please let a member of staff know.
