

## Dear Parent/Carer

The Department for Education requires us to deliver the statutory guidance for Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE). This, alongside other key areas such as RE, Citizenship and Careers, makes up our Learning for Life curriculum which is delivered at Key Stage 4 through assemblies, form time activities and curriculum days.

All Year II pupils will be participating in the third of these curriculum days on **Tuesday I7**<sup>th</sup> **September 2024.** This will replace their usual timetabled lessons.

Pupils will take part in the following sessions:

- Systems of Government students will examine different forms of government around the globe and looking at the advantages and disadvantages of each system.
- Impulsivity This is a session delivered by Warwickshire County Council. The session looks at why we participate is risk taking behaviour and which types of risks can be good and bad.
- Drugs and Vaping looking at the different types of illegal drugs, how they affect the body and the different laws in place.
- Equality Act what is the Equality Act and Protected Characteristics. How do they impact a work place?
- Mental Health what types of pressures may affect our mental health including techniques to manage these pressures.

The sessions will be delivered in form groups and our usual high standards and expectations of behaviour will apply.
