Summary

Reading

- Strong correlation between reading and achievement in <u>all</u> GCSEs including Mathematics and Science.
- GCSE papers have a reading age of 15 years, 7 months.
- High level and regular reading leads to better self-esteem / sleep / emotional regulation / concentration / memory / relationships / empathy / social skills.
- Regular readers have more new ideas / better imagination / a broader vocabulary / better writing skills.
- Parents and Carers can:
 - o Create a routine for daily reading (before sleep works well)
 - o Encourage engagement with school challenges / competitions
 - Create opportunities to choose books
 - o Model reading for pleasure
 - Discuss vocabulary
 - Talk about books / content read


Vocabulary


- Pupils need a broad vocabulary
- Create connections between words morphology and etymology
- Parents and Carers can:
 - Discuss unusual / interesting / unfamiliar words in a text
 - Support definition / pronunciation / interest in words -(https://dictionary.cambridge.org/dictionary/learner-english/)
 - Support an interest in vocabulary building and connecting

- Increased achievement
- Thriving beyond school

 - Make time for conversations
 - Model turn taking / agreeing / building / disagreeing etc
 - o Encourage opinions and discussions
 - Local news
 - National news
 - Political decisions
 - o Books / television / film / theatre
 - Talking through homework / tricky tasks as a rehearsal for writing
