






Author Visit - Ben Davis

On Tuesday 26th November 2024, **Ben Davis**, a local author came to visit Etone College. Ben is currently living and working in Staffordshire with his wife, son, and young daughter. Ben Davis writes funny books for older children and teenagers including the *Joe Cowley* series, *My Embarrassing Dad's Gone Viral* and *Make Me* Awesome. During the visit



alongside book readings, and creating characters with Ben, Etone pupils asked inciteful questions including How old were you when you started writing? Would you like to make a play of one of your books? What is your favourite book for teenagers? And Who inspires you?



They particularly enjoyed Ben telling them about including his embarrassing family members and weaving them into the stories he writes, as well as hearing about how an author is paid.

Here is what some of the pupils had to say about the visit:

'I really enjoyed hearing a book being read by actual author who had written the book.'

'We found it really interesting how he used things in his books that had actually happened to him or that he had done.'



'I found it very educational how he writes and how he finds his inspiration for her stories.'

'I really enjoyed how he used different voices and made us jump when there was shouting in his book.'

'I really enjoyed the workshop and it made me see that there is the possibility of me being an author when I leave School.'































- Open to pupils aged 9 to 14. Entries from Etone would be judged in the age 11 to 14 category.
- Opens on <u>13 January 2025</u> and closes on <u>28 February 2025</u>.
- Pupils need to write persuasively about a positive change they would like to see in their local community. This could be anything from environmental changes to mental health.
- Entries have a word limit of 500 words and must be submitted in a typed word document or PDF.
- A winner and runner up will be chosen in each age category. Prizes
 include trips to see <u>Wicked at London's Apollo Victoria Theatre</u>,
 writing workshops for our school, book bundles and shortlisted pupils
 will have the chance to be published in the Wicked Writers anthology.

Also, we have subscribed to their 8 project collections. This will mean we have access to 8 'pop up Library' boxes which will mean pupils have access to even more resources.










Warwickshire Secondary Book Award

We would strongly advise Etone pupils join Nuneaton Library to make full use of facilities, which includes books, computers and iPads. The library also has study areas where pupils could complete study and homework. Membership is **free of charge** and can be completed online: https://www.warwickshire.gov.uk/jointhelibrary

Membership of the library also brings free use of the app. 'Borrow Box' which enables the loan of eBooks and audiobooks **free of charge**. The app can be downloaded onto phones and tablets.
